

## **Empire Drugstore Building – 101 West Court Street – circa 1890.**



Built circa 1890 for F.A. (Jerry) Smith, this two-story red brick commercial vernacular building is characterized mainly by the use of contrasting color bricks around the arched windows and on the corbeled brick cornice in a typical Victorian manner. The Smith building's architectural character has been altered by the removal of the second story windows and by the remodeling of the storefront. It was initially used as a dry goods store by John Bowen which sold dry goods and groceries along with Buster Brown shoes.

The Smith Building then housed

the Burnham Empire Drug Store in 1914 after being remodeled by John Burnham. The building was rebuilt after the interior was gutted by a fire in 1919. The Burnham family sold the building in 1949.

Prior to 1900, many of the drugstores in Richland Center sold not only drugs and related items but also groceries and many other assorted items. Drugstores commonly sold not only prescribed and patented medicines but also oils, paints, perfumes, notions, jewelry, fruits and candy.

The Empire Drugstore sold additional products including Victrolas, radios, hair products and books. It also had a soda fountain.


