## ARBORETUM

The City Arboretum was established in 2003 with matching funds from an Urban Forest DNR Grant. At that time, 134 trees were planted. Since then, the arboretum has been expanded to include 200 trees and shrubs, with 65 different varieties.

The arboretum is located on Hwy 14 near the City Utilities' Waste Water Treatment Facility next to the Pine River.

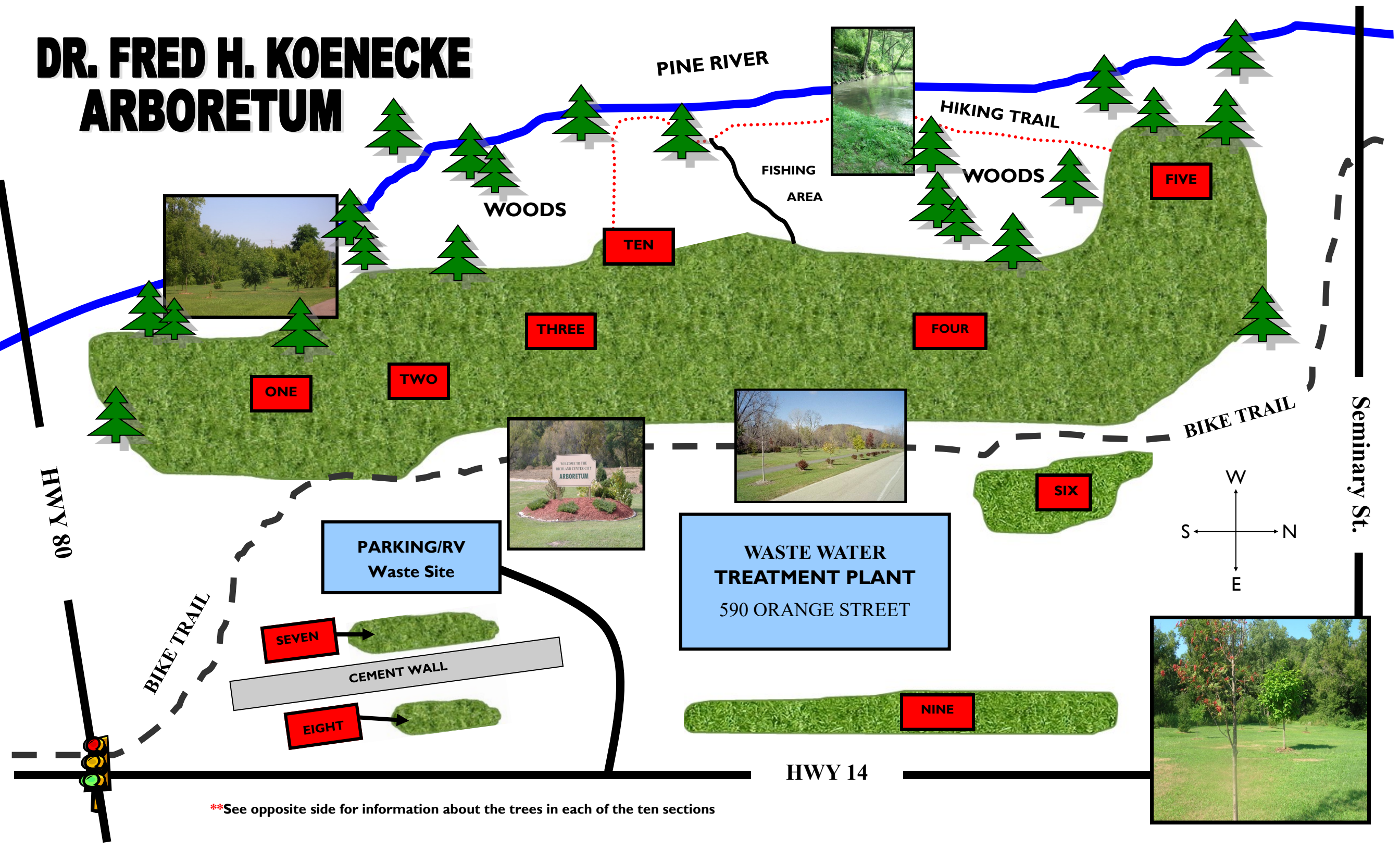
